INTRODUCTION

You probably received the GCC/IBT National Pension Fund's August 2019 Pension Communicator recently and noticed that the names and telephone numbers of your U.S. Senators were printed on the back page just to the lower left of your address. This was done in an effort to encourage all GCC/IBT-NPF stakeholders to call their two U.S. Senators and seek their support for legislation to solve the multiemployer pension crisis.

This Senator Contact Kit was prepared to assist you in preparing for your contact with your two U.S. Senators.

The goal of this effort is to have large numbers of retirees, active and inactive workers, employers and union officials associated with the GCC/IBT, and other labor unions, contact their Senators, preferably by phone or electronic message, regular letter, fax and/or through a face to face visit, if possible.

In this Kit, you will find a list of not only the 100 U.S. Senators' telephone numbers but also their addresses, fax numbers (if available) and electronic contact information as well as tips on how to prepare for your contact with your Senators.

Please read through the contents slowly and carefully to get a better feel for the methods you may wish to use to contact your Senators. There's a lot of information here so sit down with some coffee and take your time. Try as many methods as you can and encourage your fellow retirees, active and inactive workers, employers and union officials associated with the GCC/IBT, and other labor unions, to do the same. Good luck and please let us know how you make out!

WHAT IS THE ISSUE?

1. **Solving the MULTIEMPLOYER PENSION CRISIS!** If this crisis is not addressed soon, the result will be:
 - a) the insolvency of many multiemployer pension plans like the GCC/IBT-NPF;
 - b) the reduction and/or loss of participant pension benefits to the detriment of retirees, active workers and beneficiaries; and
 - c) it will cause immeasurable harm to the economy as inaction will result in the loss of billions of dollars flowing through the economy. In a study conducted in 2015, multiemployer pension plan participants were paid \$241 billion in wages and pension benefits and those participants paid over \$35 billion in federal taxes and an additional \$8.4 billion in state and local taxes. An ultimate solution will be much more costly if Congress continues to drag its feet, rather than address the crisis today.
2. **Resolving the inadequate funding of the Pension Benefit Guarantee Corporation (PBGC).** The PBGC is the arm of the federal government that insures pension plans and it recently announced that it will become insolvent in 2025 if no action is taken by Congress. The Congressional Budget Office estimates that the cost of backstopping the PBGC should it fail will be \$101 billion dollars over 20 years.

KNOW THE SPECIFICS

1. What bill are you supporting? – *Senate Bill 2254 (S.2254) commonly referred to as “The Butch Lewis Act.”*
2. What does S.2254 say? – *S.2254 calls for the creation of a loan program to allow distressed pensions plans to borrow the money they need to put plans back on solid ground and ensure they can meet their commitments to retirees and workers for decades to come.*
3. How does the proposed bill impact you and the Senators’ other similarly situated constituents? – *The pensions of retirees and current workers like myself were earned during years of hard work. To gain pension benefits, we gave up pay raises and other*

benefits. It is not our fault that these plans are on the verge of insolvency, but this awful situation will lead to a minimum of harsh benefit cuts and possibly termination of pension benefits if the PBGC goes insolvent. The loss of these pension benefits will result in serious hardship to me in my retirement and at this stage of my life there is no way for me to replace the pension income that I was promised and depend on. The U.S. government has come to the rescue of the auto industry, Wall Street as well as countless other causes. Why can't Congress resolve this issue for the backbone middle class of America?

HOW DO I CONTACT MY SENATORS?

1. There are several ways you can contact your two U.S. Senators including:
 - a) Telephone (Senator phone numbers provided in the address section of your recent Pension Communicator and herein starting on page 12);
 - b) Electronic message/email (web address to send an easy automated pre-written messages to your Senators discussed herein);
 - c) US (snail) mail (currently, incoming mail is undergoing extensive scrutiny, so it might take up to six weeks to reach your Senator);
 - d) Fax (Senator fax numbers for those who are accepting faxes provided herein) – Also, for those of you who may wish to send a letter by fax, you can try faxZERO® which allows you to send a fax to your Senator through your computer for free – go to https://faxzero.com/fax_senate.php for more information; and
 - e) An in-person meeting with your Senators and/or their aides/staffers (discussion on how to set up such a meeting discussed herein).

HOW DO I CALL A SENATORS OFFICE?

1. Call your Senators' Washington, DC offices, give the receptionist your name and ask to speak to the aid/staffer handling the multiemployer pension crisis issue.
2. Provide the aid/staffer with the information you would also include in a letter:

- a) Introduce yourself, tell the staffer where you are from, and, that you are a participant in the GCC/IBT National Pension Fund;
- b) Tell the staffer what you want (save multiemployer pension plans) - be specific! Give him/her the bill number (S.2254), a very brief summary, and why the bill is important to you;
- c) Make it personal and explain how a reduction or termination of your pension benefits would affect you.
- d) If (s)he asks you a question you cannot answer, do not panic! Tell him/her you will get back to him/her with that information. If you need help with the additional information, email us at info@gccibt-npf.org or call us at the Fund Office (630-871-7733) and we will do our best to assist you.
- e) Be brief. These folks are as busy as you are!
- f) If the staffer is not available, leave a message . . . and call back the next day, just for good measure! (S)he might be busy when you call, so suggest setting up a phone meeting at a mutually convenient time.

HOW CAN I SEND AN ELECTRONIC MESSAGE TO MY SENATORS?

The Fund has partnered with “The Action Network” to provide you with an easy on-line method to send a pre-written electronic message directly to your Senators. Visit the following site:

This website will provide you with a summary of how this crisis has developed over time and by entering your contact information, it will allow you to send a pre-written message directly to your individual Senators. In the alternative, you can modify the message to be sent to your Senators but do your best to keep it brief and to the point.

In the next section you will see that you can also send an electronic message by going to your Senators individual website and sending your comments through the Senators contact page. The Senators’ websites are set forth in the LIST OF U.S. SENATORS BY STATE which starts on page 12.

WHAT DO I SAY IN A LETTER, FAX OR ELECTRONIC MESSAGE/EMAIL?

Sample letters for retirees, vested but not retired participants, actively working participants and beneficiaries to send to their Senators (start on page 8). Very few Senators accept emails directly today. In most cases you have to access the Senators' website and submit your message through their contact page. The sample letters that follow provide you an outline of what to include in your regular mail letters, Fax or submission through your Senators' website contact page. If you wish to compose your own letter, here are some tips.

1. Introduce yourself. The reader should know your name, where you are from and that you are a retiree, vested but not retired participants, actively working participant or beneficiary participating in the GCC/IBT National Pension Fund.
2. Tell your Senator that you want him/her to support S.2254 "The Butch Lewis Act" because without it, your pension benefit could be subject to reduction or termination.
3. Make it personal! Do you have any stories about the issue at hand, or do you know people who do? Share those stories!
4. Be brief! Share a story, but be sure to be concise. The reader will have limited time.
5. Thank your Senators or their aide/staffer for his/her time.
6. If you are writing a traditional letter (not e-mail), mail or fax it to the Senators' Washington, DC offices. Remember that you have two U.S. Senators.
7. Senators have made it a bit more difficult to send emails directly to them. Some Senators will not accept emails and others require you to go to their websites to send a message.

We are providing you with a list of electronic contact information for Senators but its reliability is suspect. Communicating with your Senator through the mail or via email is less effective than speaking with someone in the Senators' office by phone or in person, but it has the advantage of being much easier for you. The down side is that your letter or email is seldom read by the person you are sending it to. Senators have three or four people on their staff that do nothing but answer the mail. The volume of mail pouring into most legislative offices is overwhelming, and your Senator simply lacks the time to personally

read and answer your letter. Almost all letters are answered using computers; only rarely does a Senator actually read his mail, and rarely signs his own letters. Good legislative offices tally incoming letters and present the Senators with the totals on given issues. Remember, in most cases, aides/staffers will be handling your letter or email. **Try to make their jobs easier, and design your letter to stand out from the clutter.**

HOW DO I SET UP AN IN-PERSON MEETING?

1. In-Person Meeting with a Senators aide/staff member – Your Senators have several offices, both in Washington, DC and in your state.
 - a) Aides/staffers in the state offices are more constituent-oriented; those in Washington, DC are more focused on the Senators legislative agenda.
 - b) Aides/staffers in both offices are good points of contact. Those in state offices are more likely to have time to meet with you and are, as mentioned above, more constituent-oriented (plus, you do not have to travel!), but the Washington, DC aide/staffer is the person managing the Senators' legislative portfolio.
 - c) Call either the most convenient state office or the Washington, DC office, introduce yourself, and ask to schedule a visit. Be sure to specify that you are calling about the multiemployer pension crisis so the receptionist puts you in contact with the appropriate aide/staffer if applicable!
 - 1) Bring others with you to the meeting if possible. You need to show the aide/staffer that this issue is important to many people, just not you.
 - 2) See above under “How do I Call a Senators Office” as a guide for your meeting.
 - 3) Thank the staff member for his/her time!
 - 4) Send a follow-up letter or e-mail to thank him/her for her/his time a second time and ask if you can be of any assistance.

2. In-Person Meeting with a Senator

- a) Call the Senators' Washington, DC office and ask how to schedule an in-state issue visit. The receptionist should be able to guide you through the process.
- b) Do not meet with your Senator alone. You want the Senator to know that many of his/her constituents feel as you do! Bringing co-workers, friends and colleagues with you helps illustrate this point.
- c) See "How do I Call a Senators Office" as a guide for your meeting.
- d) Know what you are going to say before you go in there!
- e) Send a follow-up letter or e-mail to thank the Senator for her/his time and ask if you can be of any assistance.
- f) Always be respectful, but don't be nervous - remember, your Senators work for you!

3. **If you are successful in arranging a meeting** with a Senator and/or his/her aide/staffer and you would like to discuss the meeting with someone from the Fund Office in advance of the meeting, please email or call us and we will schedule a time to discuss this important meeting with you.
